Our Family Support Offer

Early Help Family Support is a pathway to supporting you and your child, when either you or your child need further support and guidance.

Providing Early Help Family Support to our pupils and families at Eldersfield Lawn means we are more effective in promoting support as soon as we can. Early Help means additional support as soon as a problem emerges, whether this be through a child's foundation years, or later.

Early help can support children and their families who may be struggling with:

- **Routines and family rules**
- **Children who are caring for a family member**
- **Disability in the family including children being a young carer**
- **Children in the family have special educational needs (SEND)**
- **Keeping to a healthy lifestyle**
- **Children who may not want to go to school for different reasons**
- **Children who have parents who argue a lot, whether the parents live together or apart.**
- **A privately fostered child (a child from another family living in your family home)**
- **Children or parents/carers misusing drugs or alcohol**
- **Children who may need support because they live in a home and see drug or alcohol abuse or adult mental health problems**
- **Children at risk of being tricked, forced, or made to work in the criminal world.**
- **Children at risk of being groomed to join groups which support illegal views.**
- **Children who go missing from home**

Effective Early Help Family Support relies upon local groups and people in the community. Sometimes, we work together to help children and their families. Eldersfield Lawn's offer of Early Help Family Support is outlined below, as well as some of the local and national services and organisations that can support children and their families. It is recognised that everyone needs help at some time in their lives which is a shared ethos for our school.

UNIVERSAL LEVEL – Nurturing school ethos, promoting positive well-being, universal SEND provision and PSHE appropriate provision

TARGET LEVEL – Before and after school clubs, SALT communications

PPG – Funding to support targeted support and learning, enrichment support for clubs and visits

SPECIALIST LEVEL – Mental Health First Aider

OUTSIDE AGENCY - Speech and Language therapy, School Nurse, SEND

COMMUNITY SUPPORT - WCF Action for children, Starting Well information
