Review and Plans September 2025 - July 2026 (with reviews through the year)

Headlines 2025-2026

Pupil Premium Grant

- 3 children were entitled to the PPG grant during 2025-26 (3 x Ever 6)
- The school received funding of £7,175
- This funding was used to support individual children and their families. It covered the cost of trips, visits, extended schools provision and additional learning support.

Post Looked After Children

- 2 children, across 2 families were Post Looked After 2025-26.
- The total allocation of funding received last year was £2,630 (funding for one child only)
- This funding was used to support individual children by covering the cost of additional extra-curricular activities, extended schools provision and trips and visits.

Headlines 2025-2026

Pupil Premium Grant (FSM)

- 3 pupils are currently entitled to the PPG funding this year
- During 2025-2026 a total amount of £7,175 is expected (£2,391 per child)
- This funding will be used to support individual families with trips, visits, residential, extended schools provision.

Post Looked After Children

- 2 children across 2 families are currently identified as Post LAC
- During 2025-2026 a total amount of £5,260 funding is expected to be received (£2,630 per child)
- Individual Plans have been created through partnership work with each family to support children's individual needs in the most effective and appropriate way. These plans help to measure the accountability and effectiveness of how the PPG funding is used and its impact.
- The school's co-ordinator for Pupil Premium children and Post Looked After Children is Miss Sarah Hindle.
- The school's link governor for Pupil Premium children and Post Looked After children is Jason Kinghorn. Meetings are held to monitor PPG and Post LAC provision throughout the year.
