

Primary PE and School Sport Funding: Report for Financial Year 2016/17

Background

In April 2013, the Government announced new funding for Physical Education (PE) and Sport for Primary Schools. This funding is being used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision. Ofsted Inspectors assess and report on how effectively this new funding is being used when making a judgement about the quality of the leadership and management of the school.
