Children, mainly in key stage 2, but opportunities will also be sought for Year 1 and 2 children where possible. Children have accessed new and established sports during the year through the school's sports partnership and beyond. Sports opportunities have also been provided for children in Year 1 and 2 with the participation in local cricket festivals with other schools. An established link to local college facilities has also been made. The School received the Schools Games Gold Award this year for its participation.	£1,200 sports partnership £500 to help subsidise transport costs to attend KS1 and final sports events. £250 to arrange for additional staff to accompany the children to extra sports events.
